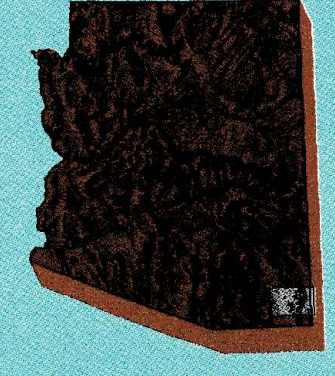


Chiricahua Peak

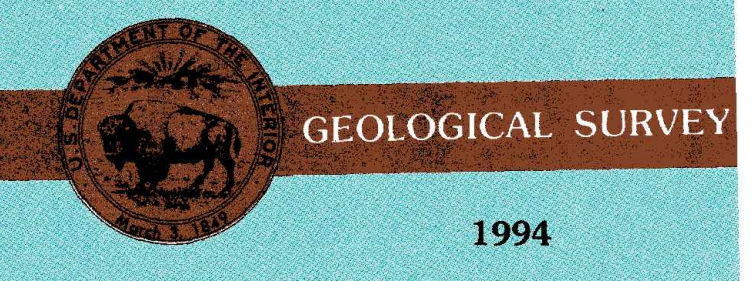
