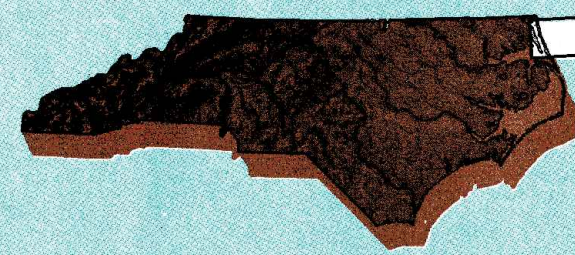


Currituck Sound NORTH CAROLINA

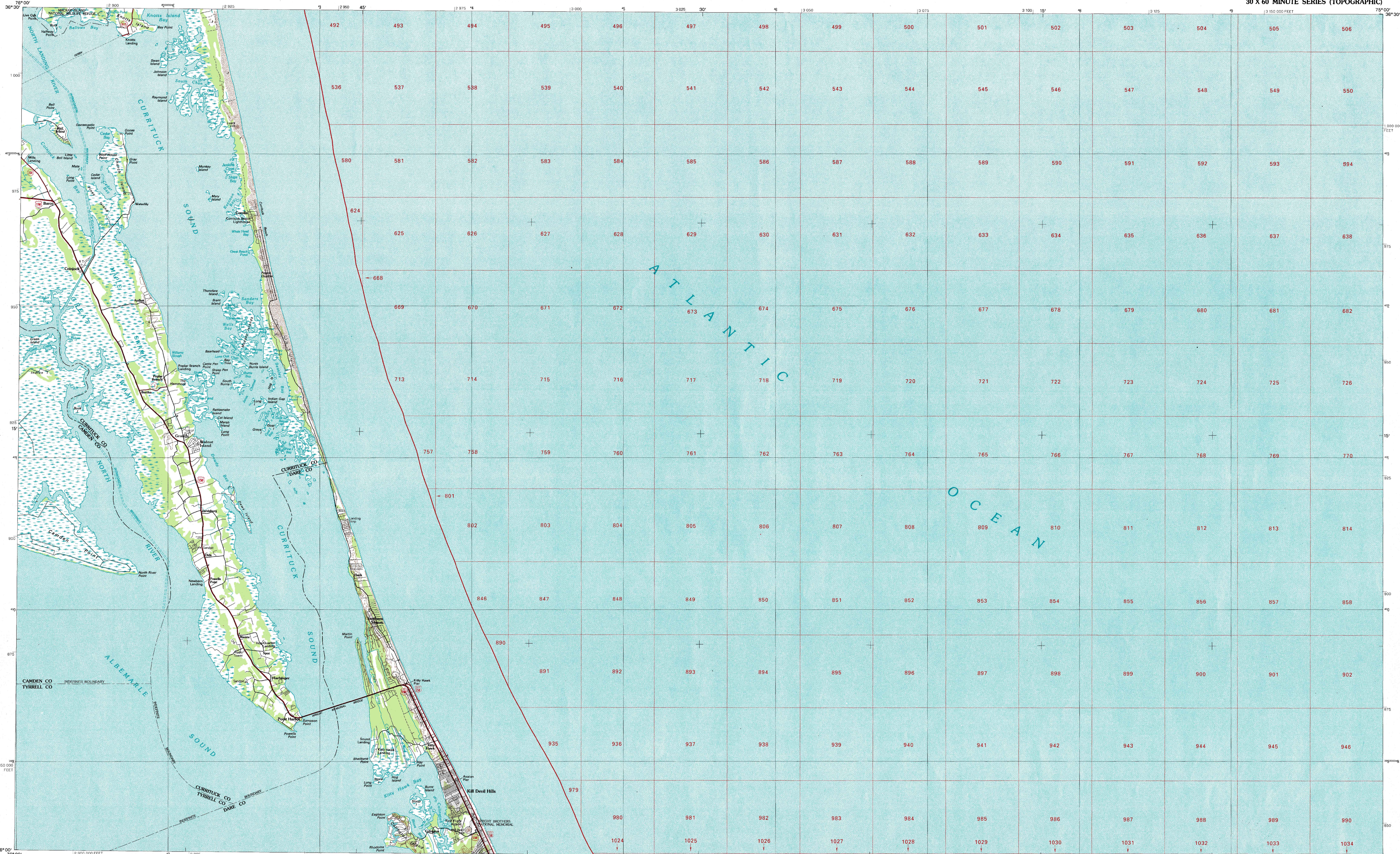
